BIRMINGHAM TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES DECEMBER 7, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:30 PM in the Township Building by Chairman Scott Boorse via a recorded virtual meeting through Zoom in order to practice safe distancing during the COVID-19 crisis. Joining the meeting in virtual mode were Vice-Chairman Michael Shiring; Supervisor J. Daniel Hill; Township Solicitor Kristin Camp; Township Engineer Lisa Donlon; Substitute Secretary Judy Jensen; and Editor of Chadds Ford Live, Richard Schwartzman.

Supervisor Hill moved to approve the November 2nd minutes as written. Vice-Chairman Shiring seconded the motion and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Vice-Chairman Shiring moved to approve the bills submitted for payment from November 3rd – December 7^{th.} General Fund bills totaled \$67,011.95. Sewer Fund bills totaled \$42,633.69. Supervisor Hill seconded the motion and the bills were unanimously approved.

ORDINANCE HEARING ON TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Ms. Camp explained that the purpose of this Zoning Ordinance amendment was to remove regulations on small wireless facilities from the Zoning Ordinance and to adopt new regulations in a stand-alone ordinance which will be codified in a separate chapter in the Birmingham Code and to make the Zoning Ordinance consistent with recent changes in federal and state laws that regulate wireless communication facilities. Ms. Camp introduced the Board exhibits as the proof of publication of tonight's hearing in the *Daily Locals News*, the email sending the proposed ordinance to the Law Library and *Daily Local News*. She also mentioned that the Township Planning Commission recommended that the Board approve this amendment at its October 13, 2020 meeting and that the Chester County Planning Commission reviewed the Ordinance and recommended that the Board adopt the same in a letter to Quina Nelling dated November 12, 2020. Chairman Boorse asked if this ordinance was the stand-alone ordinance that regulated small wireless facilities and Ms. Camp explained that this first ordinance under consideration is a zoning amendment that refers to the stand-alone ordinance and that identifies the streets and locations where small wireless facilities 45 feet in height or less may be located by conditional use of the Board.

Vice Chairman Shiring made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-04; Chairman Boorse seconded the motion. There was no public comment submitted by the public and the motion passed.

ORDINANCE HEARING ON SETBACKS FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES & AMENDMENTS FOR SOLAR FACILITIES

Ms. Camp explained that the purpose of the second Zoning Ordinance amendment was to add a definition for lot line to address the situation where property boundaries go to the center line of a street. The Township had an application where an accessory structure was proposed to be built

in the rear yard and the setback was measured from the center of the road because the lot lines went to the center of the road, not the edge of the road. The ordinance would add a definition for lot line and add setback regulations for accessory structures in all zoning districts. It also adds new regulations for solar facilities in Section 122-105.8.

Ms. Camp introduced the Board exhibits as the proof of publication of tonight's hearing in the *Daily Locals News*, the email sending the proposed ordinance to the Law Library and *Daily Local News*. She also mentioned that the Township Planning Commission recommended that the Board approve this amendment at its October 13, 2020 meeting and that the Chester County Planning Commission reviewed the Ordinance and recommended that the Board adopt the same in a letter to Quina Nelling dated November 2, 2020. Chairman Boorse asked if there were any questions on the Ordinance and the Board members had none.

Vice Chairman Shiring made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-05; Chairman Boorse seconded the motion. There was no public comment submitted by the public and the motion passed.

ORDINANCE HEARING ON SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES

Ms. Camp explained that given changes in federal and state law which regulate and encourage deployment of small wireless facilities, it is recommended that the Township adopt a new chapter in its Code to regulate those facilities that are installed within the right of ways in the Township. The ordinance identifies the purpose, defines terms used throughout, establishes an application process for obtaining a permit to install a small wireless facility, establishes fees and costs for the application, the time frame for review of the application and general design guidelines.

Ms. Camp introduced the Board exhibits as the proof of publication in the *Daily Local News*, the email sending the proposed ordinance to the Law Library and Daily Local News. She also mentioned that the Township Planning Commission recommended that the Board approve this amendment at its October 13, 2020 meeting.

Vice Chairman Shiring asked a question if the Ordinance could be adopted before the Resolution which establishes design guidelines and Ms. Camp explained that the Ordinance should be adopted first. Vice Chairman Shiring then made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 2020-06; Chairman Boorse seconded the motion. There was no public comment submitted by the public and the motion passed.

RESOLUTION TO ADOPT DESIGN GUIDELINES FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES

Ms. Camp explained that the purpose of the Resolution is to establish guidelines for the aesthetics of small wireless facilities. Attached to the guidelines are examples of acceptable facilities and acceptable suggested locations.

Chairman Boorse made a motion to adopt Resolution 2020-1207; Vice Chairman Shiring seconded the motion. There was no public comment submitted by the public and the motion passed.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION ON WWTP AND 12/9 MEETING

Chairman Boorse noted that the Board of Supervisors met with outside counsel and Ms. Camp on November 12 to discuss issues related to the Wastewater Treatment Plant, located in Birmingham Township. Chairman Boorse also announced that the Board of Supervisors will conduct a special meeting on Wednesday, December 9th at 7:00 PM to discuss the possible sale of the Birmingham Township's public sewer system to Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority. During the meeting, the Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority will make a presentation and any questions regarding their RFP and RFQ will be addressed.

AUTHORIZE ADVERTISING FOR 2021 ROAD PROGRAM

At tonight's meeting, Township Engineer Lisa Donlon noted that advertisements for the 2021 Road Program will be made on Tuesday, January 5, 2021 and Friday, January 8, 2021. A non-mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on January 12, 2021 at 10 AM via a virtual meeting. Bid opening will take place on Tuesday, January 26, 2021 at 4 PM and tentative award of the bid will occur at the February 1, 2021 Board of Supervisors meeting.

Chairman Boorse made a motion to approve the advertising schedule of the 2021 Road Program as presented by Township Engineer Lisa Donlon. Vice-Chairman Shiring seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

CREST DRIVE REPAIRS

Township Engineer Donlon said a sink hole has developed near a metal pipe on Crest Drive and an additional sink hole is starting to develop across the street from the pipe. She noted there are three options the Board could consider with regard to repair work:

- Base repair: Replace approximately 30 linear feet of pipe and complete needed concrete work. Estimated cost would be \$4,500.
- Add Alternate One: Replace part of the pipe to the piping across the street. Estimated cost would be \$3,000.
- Add Alternate Two: Replace the full length of the pipe. Estimated cost would be \$11,000.

After a discussion, the Supervisors agreed they would like to pursue the base repair option of \$4,500. If possible, they would also like to replace part of the pipe to the piping across the street (Add Alternate One).

Chairman Boorse made a motion to authorize Lisa Donlon of Vandemark & Lynch to work with an outside contractor to repair the sink hole on Crest Drive and replace part of the pipe (Base

repair and Alternate One). The cost of the project shall not exceed \$10,000. Vice-Chairman Shiring seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

Ms. Donlon also noted that there is an area of washout on Meetinghouse Road near Creek Road. The area needs additional stone installed. She said that if a contractor is working on Crest Drive, extra stone could be added at the washout area while the contractor is working in the Township, at a cost of between \$300 and \$500. Chairman Boorse agreed that the repair of the washout area could be completed during the work on Crest Drive.

ADOPTION OF FINAL 2021 BUDGET

The preliminary 2021 budget was advertised for public inspection on November 5th in the Daily Local News. Sect./Treas. Quina Nelling has updated the 2020 projected revenues, expenditures and carry forward into 2021 to include the receipts and payment to the Brandywine Conservancy for the Vision Partnership Grant.

The final budget for 2021 is as follows:

- 2021 General Fund Revenues \$2,231,953. (includes a carry forward of \$897,533.)
- 2021 General Fund Expenditures \$1,658,479.
- 2022 General Fund Carry Forward -\$573,474.
- 2021 Millage Rate remains constant @ 1.6 mills
- 2021 Sewer Fund Revenues \$747,071. (includes a carry forward of \$317,951.)
- 2021 Sewer Fund Expenditures \$471,599.
- 2022 Sewer Fund Carry Forward \$275,472.
- 2021 Sewer Rent remains constant @ \$165./edu/quarter

Chairman Boorse made a motion to adopt the 2021 Township Budget as presented at tonight's meeting. Supervisor Hill seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment from the public at tonight's meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 PM.
